Meeting Discussion

12:00-12:05 pm: Welcome – Holly Frye-Atcherson, ASAP Co-chair,

Meeting jumped off with a welcome, making sure members signed in and received an agenda, introduction of all attendees, and approval of the previous month's minutes. Coalition agreed to approval of last month's meeting minutes.

12:05-1:20: Presentation of Needs Assessment Overview & Strategic Planning – Caitlin Hall, Prevention Specialist

After receiving feedback about the approved ASAP Needs Assessment from coalition members, Caitlin did a wonderful job summarizing how the Needs Assessment came together and what contributing factors are most relevant for Strategic Planning. Pages and pages of data, key interviews, focus groups, as well as various community perspectives to narrow down what is most relevant to our coalition.

ASAP determined the readiness of the community: i.e. what does the community feel about underage drinking and binge drinking? The score was relatively low as in really not a priority at all. Our strategy of course is to make it a priority.

A few other key statistics include:

- In the past 30 days of alcohol use among high school students, Annapolis ranked greater than the whole state of Maryland
- The age of first sip of alcohol is between ages thirteen and sixteen, with a preference for liquor because it "hits you quicker"

- Law enforcement stated that fake IDs are readily available, no one is actively pursuing to prevent, there is no follow up after IDs are collected, servers are the first line of defense, not bouncers or bartenders

Our two contributing factors are 1) lack of consistent compliance checks and 2) youth and young adults use and have easy access to fake IDs

Members then split into four groups, each to work on their own Strategic Planning worksheets in accordance with four strategies:

- 1) **Enhancing responsible beverage service/seller training**
- 2) **Develop policy/procedure to reduce use of Fake IDs through Liquor Board or Annapolis City Police**
- 3) **Conduct alcohol age compliance checks and issue citations to retailers selling alcohol to youth**
- 4) **Enhance Law Enforcement capacity and commitment to address alcohol laws (to address use of Fake IDs)**
- 5) Group feedback, ideas, and opinions will be extremely helpful moving forward.
